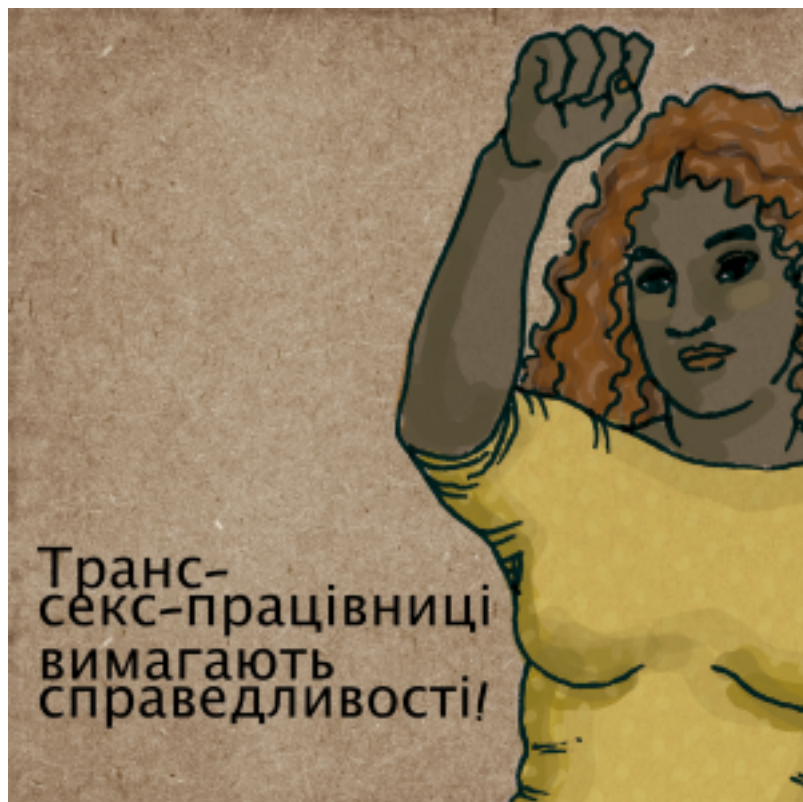

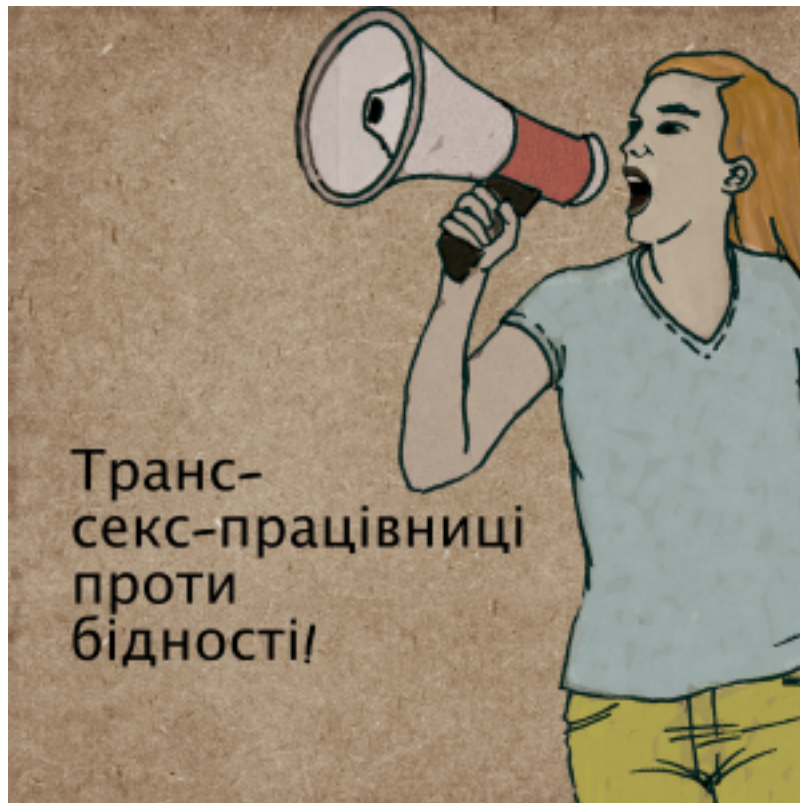

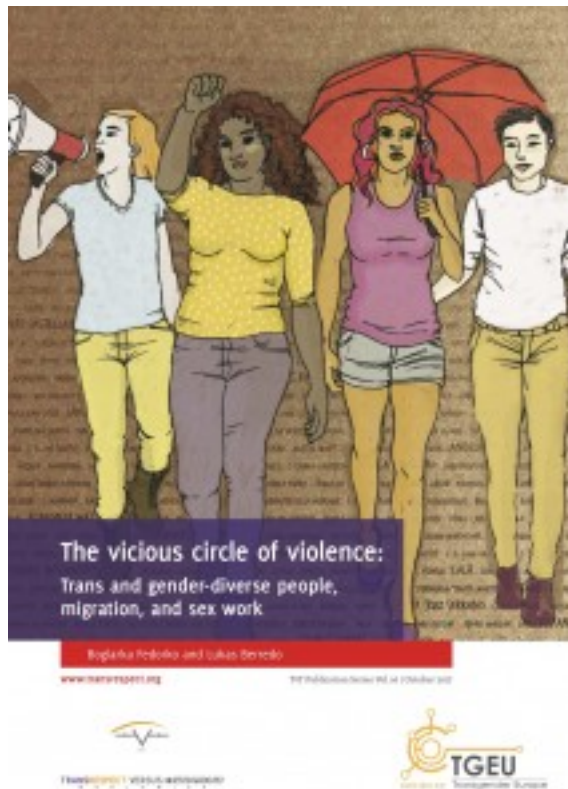

On this [International Day to End Violence against Sex Workers](#) (December 17th), Transgender Europe (TGEU) calls for the full decriminalisation of sex work.

Violence against sex workers is widespread. It is estimated that, globally, sex workers have a 45-75% likelihood of experiencing workplace violence at some point in their life, mainly due to high levels of stigma and criminalisation of sex work.

In 2015 for this day we focused on and highlighted data from the [Transrespect versus Transphobia Worldwide](#) research project which shows that 65% of the murdered trans people, between 2008 and 2015, whose occupation is known were sex workers.
